<b>Axminster's Railway</b>	For the Love of a Railway	OO-gauge	Watch express trains racing through on Axminster's main line while tiny tank engines set out for Lyme on the branch.
<b>Beampton</b>	Lucy Conborne	N	Beampton is a fictional GWR branch line set on the South Coast in the 1960s, capturing the bustle of a popular seaside destination. With its goods depot and engine shed, it blends holiday atmosphere with everyday railway operations.
<b>Buckleigh</b>	James Thick	OO	Buckleigh is a quintessential GWR branch line station, inspired by Cadeleigh on the beautiful Exe Valley line, capturing the charm of a route lost to closures in the 1960s. With its passing loop, goods facilities and additional features such as an engine shed and water tower, it blends historical accuracy with imaginative modelling.
<b>Chard Junction</b>	Ken Banks	O-gauge	Chard Junction began life as a simple rural stop in 1860 but quickly grew into a busy railway crossroads, linking main line traffic with a branch to Chard Town. Its story reflects the changing fortunes of Britain's railways — from passenger services and bustling goods yards to the rise of the dairy industry, where milk trains once left in long block formations.
<b>Claire's Tram</b>	Bob Ahrens	OO	Claire's Tram portrays a 1960s-style urban tramway, with scratch-built buildings and a mix of classic materials bringing the scene to life. Over 30 years in the making, it's a layout full of character and enduring craftsmanship.
<b>Display of narrow gauge locos</b>	Assn of 16mm Narrow Gauge Modellers (East Devon)	16mm scale	The East Devon Group of the 16mm Narrow Gauge Modellers will present a fascinating indoor display of larger-scale locomotives, more often seen running in garden railways. With many featuring live steam and impressive detail, it's a wonderful showcase of a hobby that has inspired enthusiasts of all ages for over 40 years.
<b>Foxes Sidings</b>	Andy Jones	O	A charming preserved railway where heritage meets industry, with a working brewery and local engineering firm still receiving deliveries by rail. Visitors can arrive by train for guided tours, while a fascinating mix of locomotives and rolling stock brings the line to life.
<b>Lyme Billy 2</b>	For the Love of a Railway	OO	Displayed at For the Love of a Railway's Depot (5-minute walk). The group's centrepiece model, it tells the story of the Axminster to Lyme Regis Line and includes the three stations, Cannington Viaduct and the twists and turns of a famously winding line. A must see!
<b>Made in Oz</b>	Malcolm Bard	N	A model built by one of our supporters during his years living in Australia. Now in his 90s, he has donated it to us to bring joy to children and to demonstrate that modelling is good for people of any age. Displayed at For the Love of a Railway's Depot.
<b>Memory Lane</b>	Steve Smith	OO	A nostalgic tribute to classic train sets, inspired by childhood memories of Hornby Dublo and the simple joy of railway modelling. With vintage models rescued from attics and hands-on opportunities for visitors of all ages.
<b>Morella &amp; Morella</b>	Heather Hatch	OO9	Morella Light Railways Mk1 and Mk2 are charming 009 scale layouts, lovingly displayed in memory of Don Dickson and his lifelong passion for modelling. Set in a fictional English quarry line, these compact scenes combine hand-built rolling stock, family stories and heritage charm in a wonderfully personal tribute. Photo coming soon.
<b>Newport Street</b>	Chris Fordham	4mm	Step onto the platform at Newport to relive late BR-era trainspotting, as classic locomotives give way to modern power in South Wales. Built in 4mm scale with wireless DCC and sound-fitted, carefully weathered stock, it captures a fascinating moment of railway transition.
<b>PECO</b>		TT	Display from PECO Model Railways, Beer.
<b>Penryn</b>	Derek & Julia Boswell	OO9	A lively 009 scale layout, built in just two months, featuring a simple but effective design that allows both continuous running and engaging shunting. Has DCC control, servo-operated points and the chance for visitors to take the controls, it's an interactive layout that's as fun to operate as it is to watch.
<b>Portishead TMD</b>	Nailsea & District MRC	OO	This imaginative OO gauge layout reimagines the Portishead Railway as a modern freight depot, serving local docks with DB, EWS and DRS operations. DCC sound.

<b>Puffin Colliery</b>	John Stephens	OO / OO9	Set in the Welsh countryside, Puffin Colliery combines narrow gauge and main line operation to move coal from mine to dock in a busy, atmospheric setting. It has a working colliery, sound-equipped locomotives and the occasional surprise for younger visitors.
<b>Ridgeway</b>	Wessex Wagons	TT-120	Fitting between OO and N-gauge, TT (table top) is an ideal one for many enthusiasts with space challenges. This layout also has the attraction of being controlled from an iPad, with children welcome to have a go.

<b>Seaton Scale Modellers</b>	Seaton Scale Modellers	-	A selection of cherished builds. Building and painting of plastic scale models and sometimes constructing full scale dioramas in which to display them.
<b>Stenson</b>	For the Love of a Railway	N	Displayed at For the Love of a Railway's Depot. A compact N-gauge layout on long term loan from PECO. It features a two-level design, with locos working a lower-level depot and a static InterCity 125 at the upper station. A small branch line runs an automated diesel shuttle.
<b>Terry's Railway</b>	For the Love of a Railway	OO	A work in progress children friendly model stripped back to the basics of a baseboard and track for them to add buildings and other features at For the Love of a Railway's kids workshop sessions. Displayed at For the Love of a Railway's Depot.
<b>Thomas &amp; Friends Visit Bride Bay</b>	Geoff Trenholme	OO	Constructed specifically for children of all ages to drive. It is twin track allowing for two children to be driving at the same time with no pointwork to keep things simple. It operates with one line using Digital control, the other Analogue 12 volt, allowing for demonstrations to parents showing the operational differences
<b>United Brick &amp; Clay</b>	Barrie Baker	7mm narrow gauge	A compact 7mm narrow gauge layout showcasing a busy industrial scene with a variety of locomotives and Avalon wagons. Measuring just 3' x 15", it packs plenty of character into a small space, capturing the atmosphere of a working brickworks.
<b>Up From Zummerzet</b>	Barrie Baker	OO9	A compact OO9 layout set somewhere in the Mendips, capturing the character of a quirky narrow gauge line in just 2' x 1'. With a mix of locomotives, Avalon Line wagons and distinctive "crazy track", it's a small layout full of personality and charm.
